

The shot clock is only 12 seconds long, so teams are constantly searching for a shooting opportunity. After a made basket, the team that was just on defense can "inbound" the ball by either dribbling or passing out of the restricted arc area under the basket. The ball must be "taken back" beyond the two-point arc. Following a ball out of bounds or a non-shooting foul, the ball is "checked up" not unlike a pick-up basketball game you might find in your local neighborhood.

In 3x3 basketball, players can't foul out, but each foul they commit is assessed to the team. If a team commits six fouls in a game, the opposing team earns two free throws regardless of whether the foul was shooting or non-shooting. In the rare event that a team commits 10 fouls, the opposing team still gets two free throws but also gains possession of the ball following the free throws.

Tournament Format

There are eight men's teams and eight women's teams competing in the Paris Games. The tournament begins with **pool play** in which each team will face the other seven teams in a round robin over the course of five days. Once pool play is complete, the top two teams in the standings will earn byes to the semifinal rounds while seeds 3-6 will battle it out in the quarterfinals. The 7th and 8th teams will be eliminated from the competition.

The knockout stage then begins and the single-elimination bracket will decide the medal winners for 3x3 Basketball.
