## **Top Notch Defense Guides Jets**

The Winnipeg Jets were a dark horse pick to make a deep playoff run last year after the team finished with 110 points and finished second in the Central Division behind a Vezina Trophy winning season from goaltender Connor Hellebuyck and a defense that allowed the fewest goals in the NHL. It wasn't to be though, as the team crashed out of the postseason in the first round against Colorado. The vaunted defense that had carried them all year collapsed as the team gave up 28 goals over the 5-game series loss. Head coach Rick Bowness retired after the season and assistant coach Scott Arniel was promoted to the top job.

### Forwards

The Jets lost Sean Monahan and Tyler Toffoli to free agency this year, but several talented forwards remain in Winnipeg. Kyle Connor saw his production drop last year, in part due to injury. He still managed to lead the team with 34 goals. The Jets hope to see him get back to the form he showed the two seasons before last, when he topped 80 points each year. Mark Scheifele is a two-way, playmaking center and has reliably put up 60-70 points in each of the last nine seasons. Nikolaj Ehlers rebounded from several injury plagued years and put up 61 points last year. Gabe Vilardi played just 47 games last year, but was a huge contributor when healthy with 22 goals. Cole Perfetti took a big jump in his 2<sup>nd</sup> season with a career high 19 goals and 38 points. Winnipeg will be looking for Vilardi and Perfetti to help make up for the losses in free agency. Vladislav Namestnikov had 37 points last year, but the Jets will be asking him to be their second line center to start the year even though his career statistics do not show the kind of production typically expected from a player at that spot on the depth chart. It is possible that his numbers will improve while playing with Ehlers and Perfetti, but putting him in that role could be asking a bit too much. Nino Niederreiter brings solid defensive play and is a power forward who is more than capable of driving to the net to score. He scored 18 goals last season and can be penciled in for 30-40 points.

Adam Lowry is the captain and while he has always been a good defensive forward, his offensive game has

improved in the last two years with 35 points each year. Mason Appleton found great chemistry on a line with Niederreiter and Lowry last year and it led to a career high in goals and assists for him. Morgan Barron is a valuable fourth line piece who can play all three forward positions, has size and skill, and scored a career high 11 goals last season. Alex lafallo showed promise early in his career after being signed by Los Angeles as an undrafted free agent, but his production dropped upon his arrival in Winnipeg last year.

### **Defense/Goaltending**

Josh Morrissey has developed into an elite offense-minded D-man in the last two seasons. Last year, he didn't quite reach the heights of his '22-23 season where he scored 16 goals and 76 points, but he came close with 69 points. Dylan DeMelo won't bring quite that much offense, though he did score 31 points last year and is a shutdown defenseman who is excellent at keeping the puck away from opponents and moving it out of the defensive zone. Neal Pionk creates a good amount of offense, but he is on the smaller side for a defenseman, which can cause him to lose battles along the boards and in front of the net. Dylan Samberg jumps up to the second pair after a decent season where he was an effective shot blocker. Colin Miller has often been injured, but is serviceable if healthy.

Connor Hellebuyck won the Vezina Trophy last year for the second time in his career. He finished second in the league in wins, second in save percentage, and fourth in GAA while also winning the Jennings Trophy for fewest goals allowed. He is without a doubt a top-3 goaltender right now and when he's at his best, it's extremely difficult to get the puck past him. He started the third most games of any goalie and that trend will likely continue this year, particularly since the Jets signed Kaapo Kahkonen as the backup. While Hellebuyck was the NHL's best goaltender last season, Kahkonen very well may have been the worst, with a sub .900 save percentage and the 2<sup>nd</sup> worst GAA among goalies with 25+ games played, an ugly 3.64. To be fair to Kahkonen, he spent much of last year playing for San Jose, whose defense was the worst in the league by far. His numbers improved after a late season trade to the Devils.

### The Bottom Line

Due to the losses in free agency, the Jets don't look as formidable this year. The team's center depth in particular could be suspect and may not match up well with the top teams in the league. That said, there is still plenty of talent on offense. New coach Arniel worked under the now retired Rick Bowness and should be able to keep the team playing the stellar defensive system that Bowness developed. On top of that, when you have a goalie as elite as Hellebuvck. you have a chance to win almost every game. The Jets may not be Stanley Cup contenders as they were last year, but they will remain in the playoff conversation.

### JETS 5-YEAR POINT TREND


