How Olympic Water Polo Works

Water polo is a competition between two teams of seven players. The objective of the game is to score points by throwing the ball into the opposing team's goal over the course of a four eightminute quarter game.

The pool is three meters deep, so the players are either swimming or treading water during the entire game. Players may only hold the ball with one hand with the exception of the goalkeeper.



The goalkeeper is allowed to block a shot attempt and can even punch the ball out of the air. However, a goalkeeper cannot push the ball underwater and they are only given the ability to touch the ball with two hands in the five-meter area in front of their goal (not unlike the box in soccer).

Once a team gains possession of the ball, a 30-second shot clock starts counting down and is reset when a shot is attempted or when the other team gains possession of the ball. The team with the ball can pass the ball or swim forward with the ball in an effort to get as close to the goal as possible for the most ideal shot attempt. The game itself is very physical and players often make contact with one another. However, there are several rules in place and a violation of those rules results in a penalty.

Penalties include "holding" or "sinking" a player on the offensive team who doesn't have possession of the ball. Splashing water into the face of an opponent also results in a penalty. There are three levels of violations. A minor foul results in a brief stoppage of play to allow the offended team to restart their possession. A player who commits a major foul is "kicked out" for 20 seconds and swims to the equivalent of the penalty box. The fouled team has the "man up" advantage for 20 to seconds or until they score or lose possession of the ball. A player fouls out if they receive three major fouls in the same game. The fouled player may receive a penalty shot if the foul occurred during a potential scoring chance. This penalty shot is awarded at the five-meter line and only the goalkeeper is allowed to defend the shot attempt.

Tournament Format

Both the men's and women's events begin with group play. The teams are separated into two groups. Each team will face each of the opposing teams in their respective groups and the top four teams will advance to the knockout stage of the tournament. In the quarterfinal round, the losing teams are out of medal contention but will still have the opportunity to compete in "placement matches" to determine the 5th-8th places.

Why the funny hats?

They might look a bit funny, but there's a few specific reasons why water polo players wear "caps". For one, the caps are both colored and numbered so that a team and a player can be identified. The padding also prevents possible head injuries from the water polo ball or from overly aggressive defenders.
